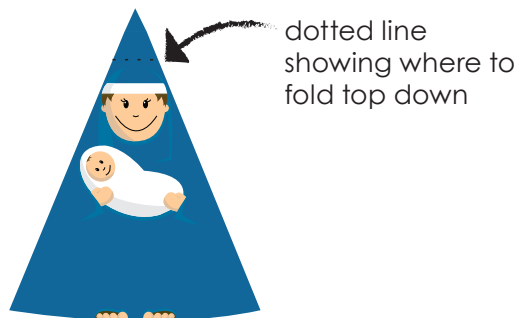


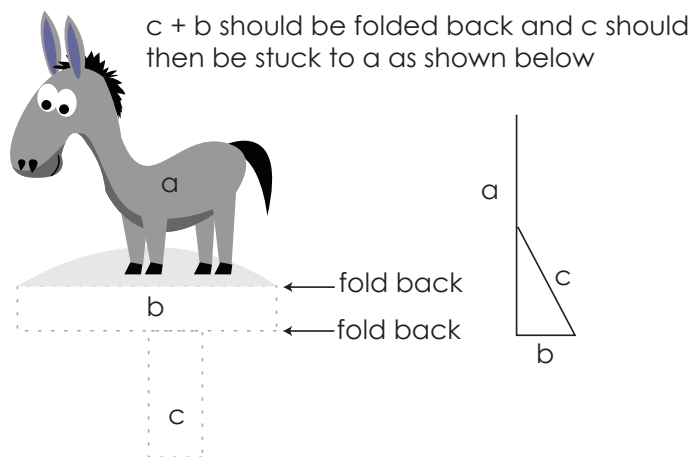
1. Print out each sheet of Nativity characters and the stable background.
2. Cut out each of the characters. The background to the stable does not need cutting.
3. Roll each semi circle chracter into a cone shape and stick the overlapping edges together. Fold over the point at the top so the head is flat on top.

4. Cut out the donkey carefully. Remember to leave on the bottom tabs for folding and sticking so that the donkey can stand up. (The donkey can also be stuck onto card before cutting out to make it stronger).

5. The background to the stable should be stuck onto a piece of card (i.e. an old cereal box) or on the inside of an old shoe box so it is able to stand up. The characters can then be arranged at the front to make your very own mouse club nativity display.

Here's an example with Mary, Joseph and the donkey. You can have lots of fun deciding where each of the characters should go.

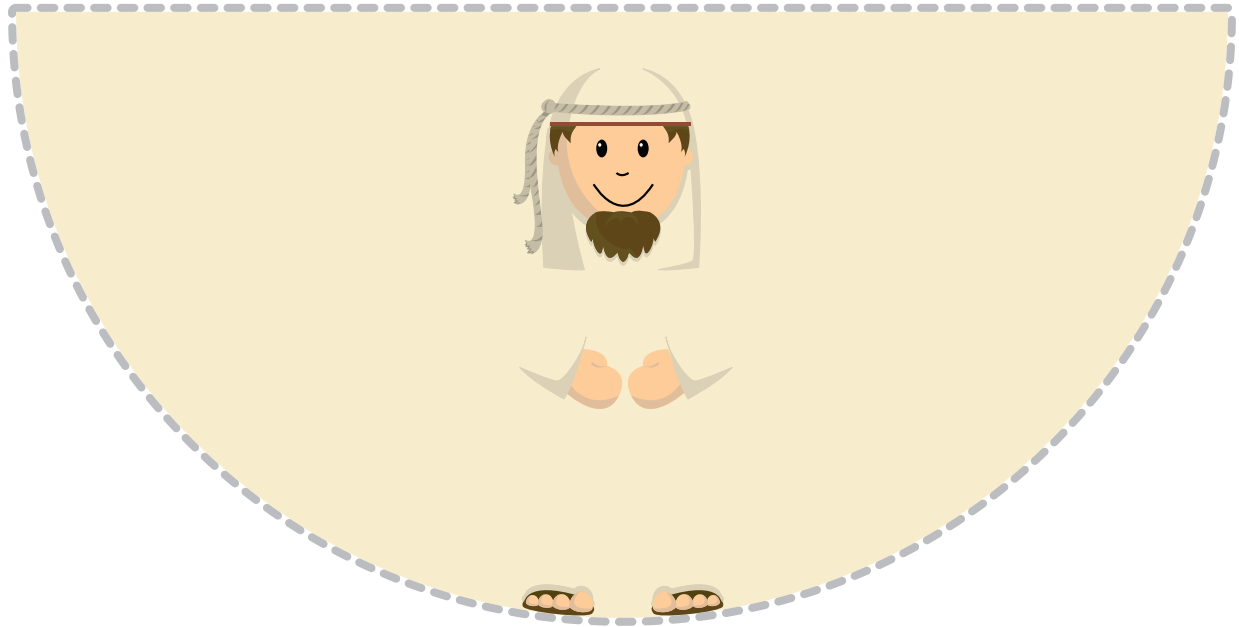
