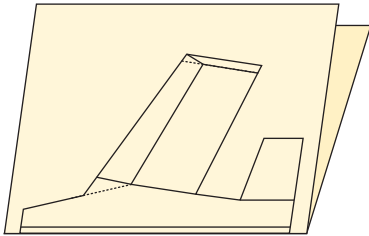


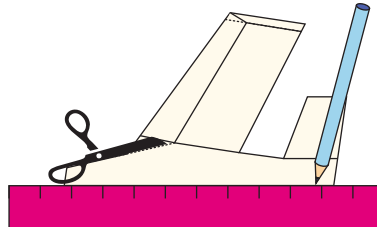
Grandad's Jet Plane

Make your own jet plane by following Grandad's easy step by step instructions.

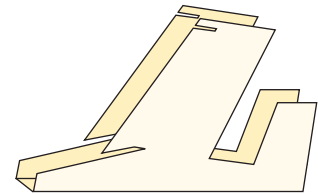
You will need: Scissors, glue or double sided sticky tape, thin card, a pencil, a ruler, plasticine or blu-tac and an adult to help with the cutting out.



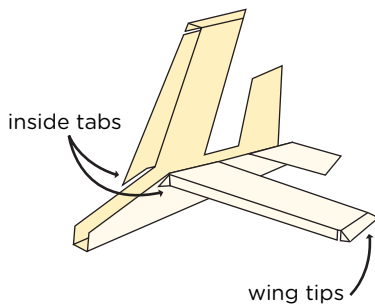
1. Fold your piece of thin card in half and draw around Grandad's template, making sure that the fold is at the bottom.



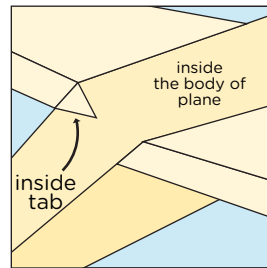
2. Cut out your jet plane and then carefully cut along the two dotted lines. Score the solid lines so that it makes a crease on both sides.



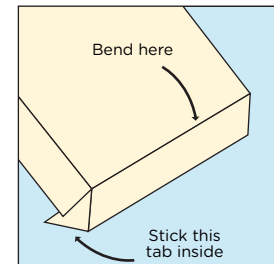
3. The plane has a flat bottom so you need to unfold the card and smooth the fold flat. Next fold along the two bottom score lines so that both sides stick up in the air.



4. Bend the wings and tail along the score lines, so that they stick out on either side.

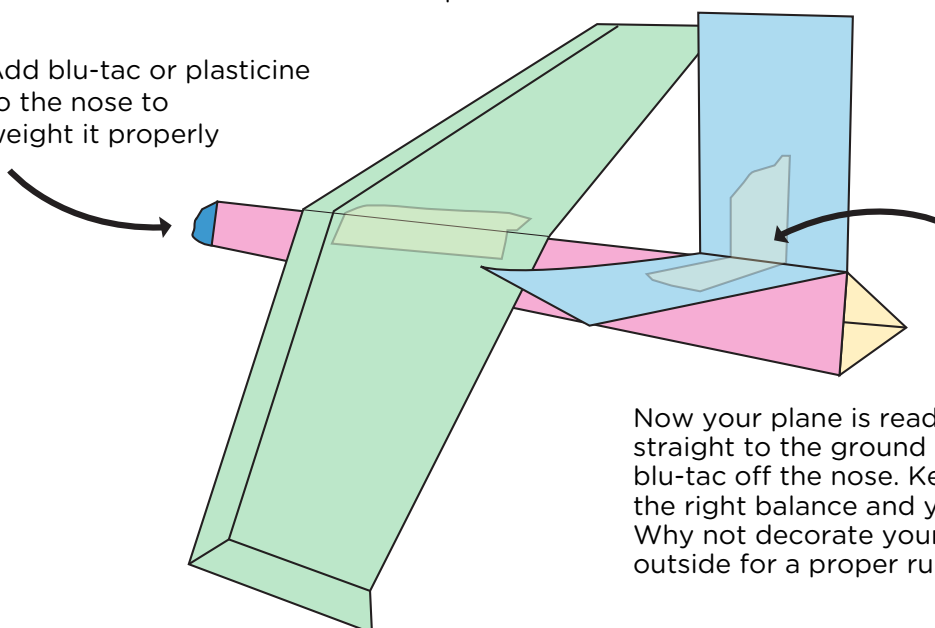


5. Fold along the score line of the inside tabs and stick them inside the body of the plane.



6. Now fold the wing tips along the score line, bend around the tab and stick them under the front of the wing.

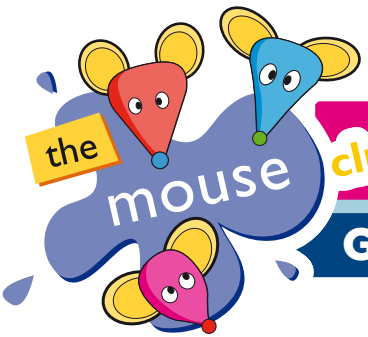
Add blu-tac or plasticine to the nose to weight it properly



Tape the body together and add tape to the tail to make a 'V' shape.

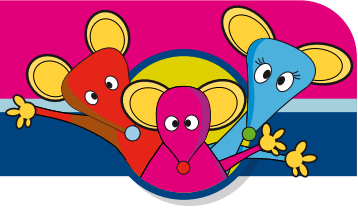
Now your plane is ready to fly. If at first it falls straight to the ground then take some of the blu-tac off the nose. Keep doing this until you have the right balance and your jet plane flies properly. Why not decorate your jet plane before taking it outside for a proper run?

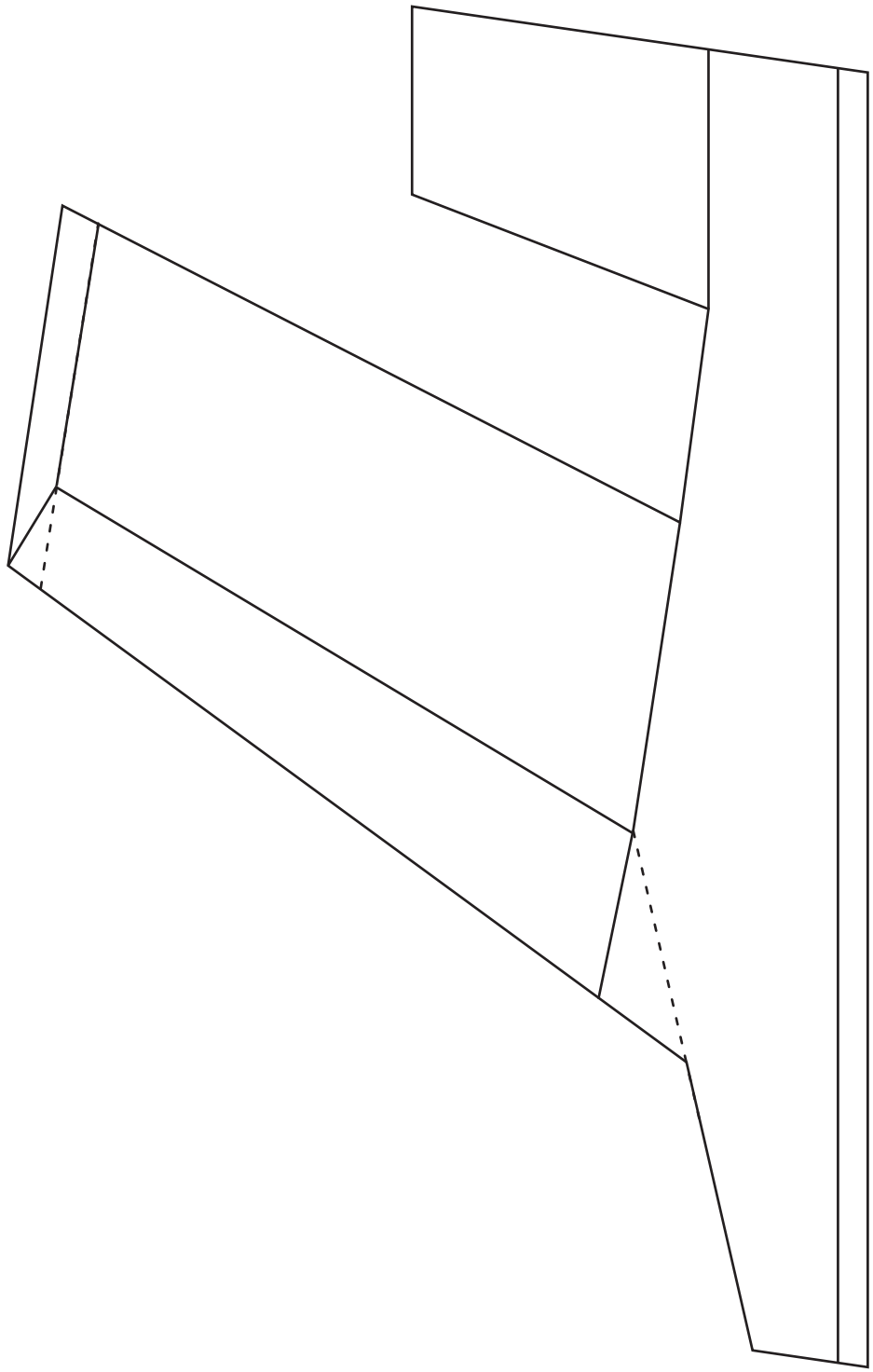
